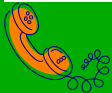

P & C Parent Contact Lists

This process is not managed or monitored by the school. By completing details on this form, please understand your details will be shared with other parents.

For those parents using the contact list please note that content considered inappropriate for distribution via the parent contact list includes use of phones and emails containing:

- chain letters or hoax emails;
- spam e.g. unsolicited advertising material;
- negative or derogatory content about the school, its systems, staff, parents/carers or students.
- unacceptable or unlawful material or remarks, including offensive, threatening, defamatory or discriminatory content about a person or organisation;
- sexually explicit or suggestive material or correspondence;
- messages used for own commercial/personal interests, political lobbying or any unlawful purpose.

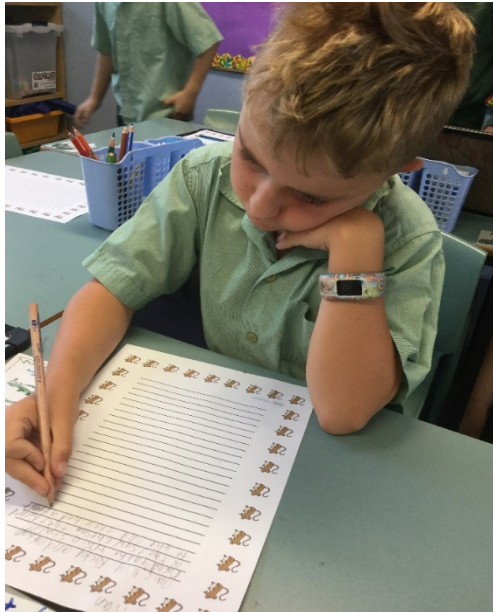
Planning Our Writing in 1M

Last week the students in 1M were learning to develop a plan for their stories. They brainstormed different characters, settings, problems and resolutions before developing their own story plan. Planning a story helps children organise their thoughts and fosters coherence.



Using Interesting Sentence Beginnings in 3S

The 3S students were learning to begin their sentences in different and interesting ways. They found and shared great examples of openers from the books they were reading, before sharing awesome sentence openers students had used in their writing over the recent weeks. They then brainstormed words ending in -ly, -ed and -ing that could be used to begin sentences eg *Carefully, she crept...* before improving a given sentence with an interesting beginning.

Purchase Pride Badge (10 Purchase Prides)



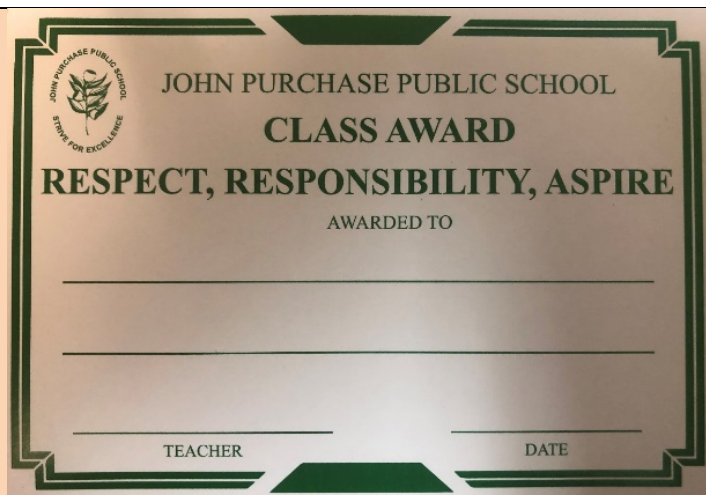

What do I do with my Class Awards?

A clear, snap lock bag is ideal for this purpose!

Got It!



Flipping Your Lid

The **thinking brain** (upper brain) allows us to think rationally, make decisions, and problem solve with kindness and empathy.

The **emotional brain** (lower brain) is where our reactions, emotions, and automatic responses come from.

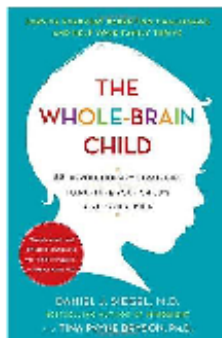
Sometimes when our emotions become too overwhelming we '**flip our lid**'. This means that our thinking brain has gone offline, leaving us with only our emotional brain in use. When this happens, we are unable to think reasonably, make good decisions, or problem solve effectively. We need to calm our big feelings to reboot our thinking brain and bring it back online.

What this means for children:

- Children's brains aren't fully developed so they 'flip the lid' more often and need more help 'reconnecting' their thinking brain
- When children 'flip the lid' it is not a time to try and rationalise or reason with them. We need to teach and help them to calm down. You will know what works best for your individual child e.g. hugs or soothing gestures or physical activity to help them return to a calm state.
- Positive time outs can also help children (and adults) calm down. The problem will still be there to be addressed when everyone is a bit calmer.
- "Name it to tame it", verbally label the emotion (e.g. "It sounds like you were really upset when ... happened")

FROM THE P & C



Who are we?

The JPPS Parents and Citizens (JPPS P&C) Association is the focal point for parent involvement at the school and provides a place for parents to discuss and debate matters of interest relating to the school and community.

All parents or guardians of children at JPPS are welcomed and encouraged to become members of the P&C. It costs \$1 per year to be a member.

The P&C holds regular meetings throughout the school year. All parents and carers are welcome to attend, hear about what is happening around the school, propose ideas and participate.

Each March, an Annual General Meeting is held and an executive committee is appointed. Nominations and votes come from members who attend that meeting.

The executive committee oversees the Association's operation while co-ordinators or sub-committees look after each of the services which the P&C provides.

What do we do?

The P&C provides strong community support for the school by encouraging parents to be involved in the workings of the school.

We run many events and provide a number of services for students and families. These include:

- School Canteen with a focus on healthy food choices (open Mon – Fri)
- A uniform shop at the school (open Mon, Wed & Fri)
- A second-hand uniform pool
- The Concert Band and Training Band
- Events such as discos, sausage sizzles and morning teas
- Easter Raffle and Colouring Competition
- Mother's Day and Father's Day stalls and breakfast
- Entertainment Book
- Fundraising Events such as Fairs and Colour Runs to provide improvements to the school and new resources for students

Many of our long-term P&C members will be moving onto the high school next year, we are in need of other parents to step up and organise these events for 2020 or they may not happen. We are happy to advise and provide documented guidelines to help you.

Where the funds go?

The P&C has the purpose of advancing education and supporting our students and school community. It is important to continue fundraising to ensure we can meet this purpose.

In the past 2 years, the JPPS P&C have been able to fund the following major projects:

- \$50K to subsidise the school learning support teacher
- \$21K of new projectors for 7 rooms in 2019 and \$30 for 13 projectors in 2018
- \$10K for K-2 synthetic grass
- \$1.5K of gardening and outdoor learning equipment
- \$20K for 5 new air con units
- \$770 new ice cream freezer for the canteen
- \$1K for new sports tops for PSSA teams and students representing JPPS in sporting carnivals
- \$70K for the renovations of the school canteen

With the major canteen renovation cost this year, the P&C will need to drive new fundraising efforts to support future projects. The P&C are keen to hear from parents in the school who would be able to organise and run fundraising events in 2020.

Benefits of participating

P&C activities create opportunities for parents and carers, students and staff to interact, building a feeling of respect and a stronger, safer, school community.

When you participate, you benefit by:

- meeting other parents in the community
- understanding more about what happens at school
- getting to know the teachers better
- sharing your skills with other parents/teachers and learning new ones
- helping out sets a good example for your children

Your children will benefit too. Research shows that when parents are involved, students get better grades, have a better attitude to school and improved behaviour!



Helping out

The P&C values the rich diversity of skills and experiences that each family brings to the school. We appreciate any help that families are able to offer.

Ways you can help include:

- Help for a few hours in the canteen
- Help out in the uniform shop
- Attend P&C meetings or participate on P&C sub-committees
- Help organise and coordinate fundraising events
- Help out at school garden working bees
- Bake for fundraising events
- Cook at community BBQs
- Volunteer at any of the many P&C events throughout the year

School Zone Road Safety

December 2019

End of year road safety tips for parents and carers

The lead up to Christmas and the holiday period can be a very busy time of year. With this comes traffic congestion, fatigue and distraction. Here are some tips to help you get through it:

- Allow extra travel time to get to places.
- Avoid alcohol if you plan to drive.
- If travelling with packages in your car, place them in the boot or restrain them with a seatbelt to avoid them moving about while driving. In a crash unrestrained objects can cause severe injury to vehicle occupants.
- Ensure pets are properly restrained.

Tips for preparing to walk or cycle to school in 2020

Now is a great time to think about and plan how your family will travel to school next year. Walking (even part of the way), cycling, or catching a bus to school is a great alternative to school zone congestion.

- Plan a safe route with your child/ren.
- Identify safe crossing locations.
- Discuss how to spot dangers such as vehicles exiting driveways.
- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Leave balls, mobile phones, and headphones in your bag.



NSW double demerit driver and rider offences

Double demerit points apply for speeding, seatbelt, motorcycle helmet and mobile phone offences during the following holiday periods:

Christmas Day to New Years Day:
Starts Friday 20 December 2019 to Wednesday 1st January 2020 (inclusive).

Australia Day:
Starts Friday 24th January 2020 to Monday 27th January 2020 (inclusive).



In the car - Journeys with kids

It is important your child is restrained in the correct child car seat for their age and size:

- It is recommended to keep children in a booster seat until they are at least 145cm in height.
- A child that is correctly secured in an approved child car seat is less likely to be killed or injured in a crash than one who is not.



Model safe and considerate behaviour for your child. Remember, road safety starts with you!

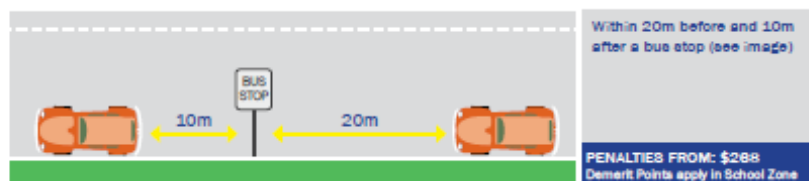
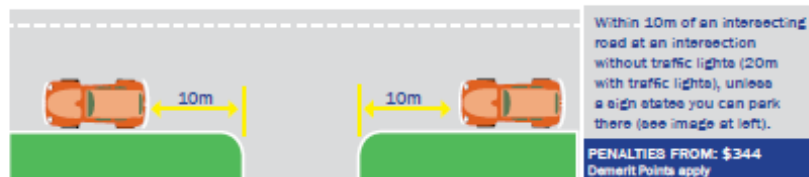

Parking Rules

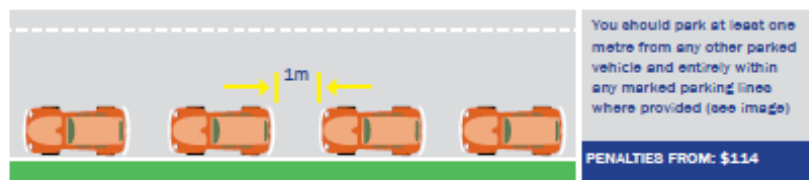
Please park safely and legally on the streets around your school. Park legally so you do not incur parking fines and demerit points. Council's Traffic Compliance Officers enforce parking around schools. If you park contrary to the road rules you will be fined!

Parallel parking

This is the usual way to park unless signs tell you otherwise. You must park in the same direction as the adjacent traffic and parallel and as close as possible to the kerb.

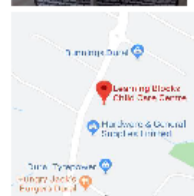
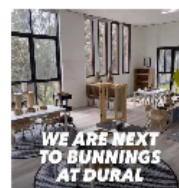

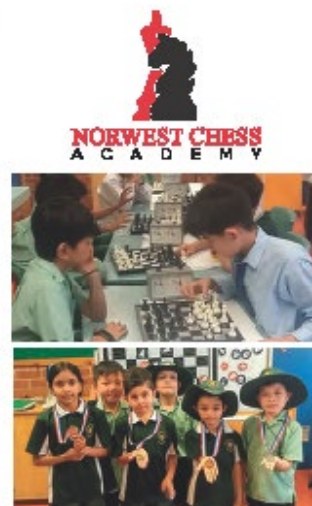
