

A BIG THANK YOU TO OUR P & C AND NSW GOVERNMENT

Last year our P and C successfully applied for the NSW Government's Community Building Partnership (CBP) Grant, to purchase outdoor seating. We were delighted that the P & C were awarded \$20000 to purchase the seating and voted to fund around \$5000 or \$6000 to pay for the difference between the grant funds and the cost of the furniture. These will be placed outside eight brick classrooms. We are very excited that a previously underutilised teaching, learning and socialising space is now being fitted with colourful seating.

It didn't take long (less than one day) before students were using the new furniture to collaborate, during their lessons.






We are very appreciative of the P and C's work in preparing the application and subsequent paper work required, and for the funding provided by the NSW Government's CBP Program.

Parent Interviews with Class Teachers



Purchase Pride Badge (10 Purchase Prides)

What do I do with my Class Awards?



When a student has received ten green/white class awards (pictured above), they should be handed in to Mrs King's 'award shelf' in the administration corridor. The ten class awards need to be bundled together and **clearly labelled** with the student's name, current class and award level reached:

10 Class Awards = Bronze 20 = Silver 30 = Gold 40 = Bronze Medallion 50 = Silver Medallion 60 = Gold Medallion 75 = Platinum Medallion and Principal for the Day!

A clear, snap lock bag is ideal for this purpose!

With the exception of Bronze Awards (which are published at the end of the term and presented at a Principal's morning tea for students and parents), all awards received by 3pm on Thursday afternoons, are 'stamped' and published in the next school newsletter, which is usually on the following Monday. At this time, I indicate when these awards will be presented at the next Thursday afternoon assembly.

Students need to be responsible for their own awards, as replacements are not issued.

Got It!



What is 'co-regulation'?

Children are born with many emotions but without the language or ability to understand and manage them. We teach them how to be calm by doing it with them: rocking, patting, hugging, and quiet talking.



Children have good days and bad days when managing their feelings - just like the rest of us. They are sensitive to stress, lack of sleep, noise, arguments, etc. This can make paying attention to teachers and parents very difficult at times.

When a calm adult helps a child to stay calm and provides support for the child's emotional experiences, they become 'in tune' with each other. Being 'in tune' is important because children need to learn to co-regulate their emotions (manage their emotions with their parents help) before they can self-regulate (manage their emotions without help).

Activity: Feelings Chart

Print out the attached feelings chart and use the template to brainstorm with your child:

- What signs they show on the outside to reflect how they feel on the inside?
- What activity or strategy they could use to help them to feel calmer?
- What activity or strategy could others use to help them to feel calmer?

Tip: Keep it on your fridge to use as a daily reference for how to manage big feelings

This app provides breathing and problem solving practice for children.



Settle Your Glitter by Momentous Institute (free app).
This app guides children through deep breathing exercises that allow them to regain control of emotions.

ATTENTION YEAR 4 PARENTS - Intention to Apply: Year 5 Opportunity Class Placement 2022

Government schools use a range of strategies to meet the educational needs of gifted and talented students. One strategy is Opportunity Class placement for the last two years of primary school, which provides intellectual stimulation and an educationally enriched environment for gifted and talented students. Offers for Opportunity Class placement will be made on the basis of the Opportunity Class Placement Test results and school assessment. The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be held on **Wednesday 21 July 2021** at a venue to be announced.

If you would like your child to apply for Opportunity Class placement in Year 5 in 2022 please note all applications are completed online.

The application website opens on **Tuesday 20 April 2021** and closes on **Friday 7 May 2021**: https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5.

Parents and carers must apply from the website at that time. The High Performing Students Unit does not accept late applications.

The Opportunity Class Placement Test will change in 2021 for placement in 2022. The new test will consist of thinking skills, mathematical reasoning and reading comprehension. In 2021 the placement test will remain in a paper-based format.
